# Written Assessment Tasks



The following information describes what the *Written Assessment Tasks* will look like and what you are required to complete.

## Navigating the National Quality Framework Written Assessment Task

On commencement of your qualification you will be asked to complete an initial *Written Assessment Task*, called the *Navigating the National Quality Framework Written Assessment Task*. This Assessment task has been developed to cover the following knowledge requirements from a number of units from the CHC30113 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care.

How to access the:

- National Quality Standard
- relevant approved learning framework
- United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child.


These skills and information are relevant for many units of competency, including:

- CHCECE001 Develop cultural competence
- CHCECE002 Ensure the health and safety of children
- CHCECE003 Provide care for children
- · CHCECE004 Promote and provide healthy food and drinks
- CHCECE005 Provide care for babies and toddlers
- CHCECE007 Develop positive and respectful relationships with children
- · CHCECE010 Support the holistic development of children in early childhood
- · CHCECE011 Provide experiences to support children's play and learning
- CHCECE012 Support children to connect with their world
- CHCECE013 Use information about children to inform practice.

By completing this Assessment at the beginning of your qualification you will become familiar with these documents and also demonstrate your ability to navigate through these documents in one go. This means there will not be repetitive questioning throughout each Assessment task for each of the above units.

**Note:** This Assessment must be completed prior to being deemed 'competent' in these units. Therefore, if you have completed all other Assessment requirements of these units and have NOT completed this *Written Assessment Task* you must do so as soon as possible. Speak to your Trainer and/or Assessor if you have any questions regarding this Assessment.


## Unit-specific Written Assessment Tasks



### Title page

The title page clearly indicates the code and name of the unit of competency.

### Assessment Cover Sheet



The Assessment Cover Sheet is designed for the Assessor to provide feedback. You must complete the 'Learner Details' section and the declaration/s and attach the Assessment Cover Sheet to your completed Written Assessment Task prior to submission.

To correctly complete this form, you must:

- write your name, date of birth and address (this is very important for verification of your ID) in the 'Learners Details' box
- tick and sign the declaration boxes to declare that you are submitting your own work.

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
Once your Assessor marks your *Written Assessment Task*, they will:

- · provide feedback in the relevant sections
- tick either the 'satisfactory' or 'not yet satisfactory' box to indicate the outcome of the Assessment
- write their name, signature and date of Assessment.

#### Written Assessment Tasks in detail

#### A note on resubmissions

There is a space for information on the resubmission of your *Written Assessment Task* (your Assessor will provide you with information on resubmission procedures) and to declare that the submission is your own work. These additional sections do not need to be completed once the *Written Assessment Task* is assessed as 'satisfactory'.



The Written Assessment Tasks have been developed to provide an Assessment of your knowledge and understanding of each unit. The Written Assessment Tasks vary in the number of parts and questions they have and the style of questioning. They require you to provide examples of real life situations, to reflect, to explain, to consider and to document. The Written Assessment Tasks are one piece of the Assessment puzzle. Alone, they do not demonstrate your full knowledge and skills of the unit; however when accompanied by the Practical Assessments and *Third-Party Reports*, your Assessor can see a full picture of your competence.
